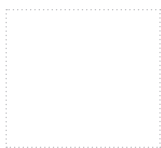
The membership of *AMIS* includes collectors, historians, curators, performers, instrument makers, restorers, dealers, conservators, teachers, students, and many institutional members.

MEMBERSHIP

Members receive the annual publications, are invited to attend and submit proposals for the annual meetings, and are eligible for all of the awards. All individual members have full voting privileges.

ANNUAL MEETINGS

The Society regularly holds meetings at which papers, demonstrations, performances, panel discussions, and tours are presented. These gatherings offer excellent opportunities to meet and talk with others who share an interest in musical instruments. Recent meetings have occurred at **The Metropolitan Museum of Art** (New York), the **National Music Museum** (Vermillion, South Dakota), the **Library of Congress** (Washington), the **Musical Instrument Museum** (Phoenix), and the **Yale University Collection of Musical Instruments**.

AWARDS

Curt Sachs Award: Presented annually to a person who has made outstanding contributions to the study of musical instruments.

Frances Densmore Prize: Awarded annually for the most significant article-length publication in English relating to musical instruments.

Nicholas Bessaraboff Prize: Awarded annually for the most distinguished book-length publication in English relating to musical instruments.

William E. Gribbon Memorial Award: Several given each year to enable undergraduate and graduate students to attend the Society's annual meeting.

The Frederick R. Selch Award: Awarded to the best student paper at the annual meeting.

JAMIS Publication Grant: An annual grant of up to \$750 to help defray the costs of preparing an article appropriate for publication in the *Journal of the American Musical Instrument Society*.
